During the Panel discussion, panellists Dr. Mangai and Ms. Revathi impressed upon the students on the need for gender inclusivity at varied levels.

In the second session on Inclusivity and Disability, Dipti Bhatia, CEO, National Association for the Blind, Tamil Nadu State Branch and Mr. A.
